OUR GOALS

- Ending hunger means fulfilling the right to food by ensuring all people at all times are able to access enough food for an active, healthy life;
- Ending hunger is the shared responsibility of individuals, communities, the private sector, non-profits, faith-based organizations, and government;
- Ending hunger is not a partisan issue;
- Ending hunger requires both a strong safety net and policies that expand opportunity and reduce poverty;
- Elections provide an exceptional opportunity to make ending hunger, poverty and opportunity a higher political priority;



• Therefore, we plan to work together to engage voters and candidates around the goal of ending hunger by 2030.

WHAT'S AT STAKE?

- One out of every 8 U.S. households more than 41 million Americans- struggle to put food on the table. These numbers include 4.9 million seniors and 12.9 million children.
- Around the world, 815 million people experience hunger every day.
- The impact of hunger reaches far beyond just those families and individuals who
 experience it. Hunger has a devastating impact in the lives of children. Hunger affects
 brain development. It makes it harder to learn in school and puts our children at risk
 of chronic health issues.
- Irreversibly harming a child's cognitive and physical development in turn makes it harder for them to find employment later in life.
- Hunger burdens our economy with lost productivity and increased, avoidable healthcare costs.
- Hunger and inadequate nutrition for seniors exacerbates already existing health challenges, accelerates physical impairment, impedes recovery from illness, injury and surgery, and increases risk of chronic disease.

It's time to reaffirm our commitment to the ideal of ending hunger. We must not tolerate hunger – and we don't have to. Ending hunger is not a partisan issue and is something we can all support.
