OUR GOALS

- Ending hunger in the United States and worldwide by 2030 is possible;
- Ending hunger requires strong commitment and leadership from the U.S. government;
- Ending hunger means fulfilling the right to food by ensuring all people at all times are able to access enough food for an active, healthy life;
- Ending hunger is the shared responsibility of individuals, communities, the private sector, non-profits, faith-based organizations, and government;
- Ending hunger is not a partisan issue;
- Ending hunger requires both a strong safety net and policies that expand opportunity and reduce poverty;

- The 2016 election provides an exceptional opportunity to make ending hunger, poverty and opportunity a higher political priority;
- Therefore, we plan to work together to engage voters and candidates around the goal of ending hunger by 2030.

WHAT'S AT STAKE?

- More than 48.1 million Americans (15.4 percent of the population) live in households that struggle against hunger. These numbers include 5.4 million seniors and 15.3 million children.
- Around the world, 795 million people experience hunger every day.
- The impact of hunger reaches far beyond just those families and individuals who experience it. Hunger has a devastating impact in the lives of children. Hunger affects brain development. It makes it harder to learn in school and puts our children at risk of chronic health issues.
- Developing countries can lose up to 11 percent of their economic output as a result of hunger. Yet every \$1 invested in combatting global malnutrition sees a \$16 return.

It's time to reaffirm our commitment to these ideals. We must not tolerate hunger – and we don't have to. Ending hunger is not a partisan issue and is something we can all support.
