- Midterm elections will be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018.
- All 435 seats in the House of Representatives are up for elections.
- 35 Senate seats are up for elections, including two special elections (see List of States below).
 - 25 Democratic seats
 - 8 Republican seats
 - 2 Independent seats (who caucus with the Democratic Party)
